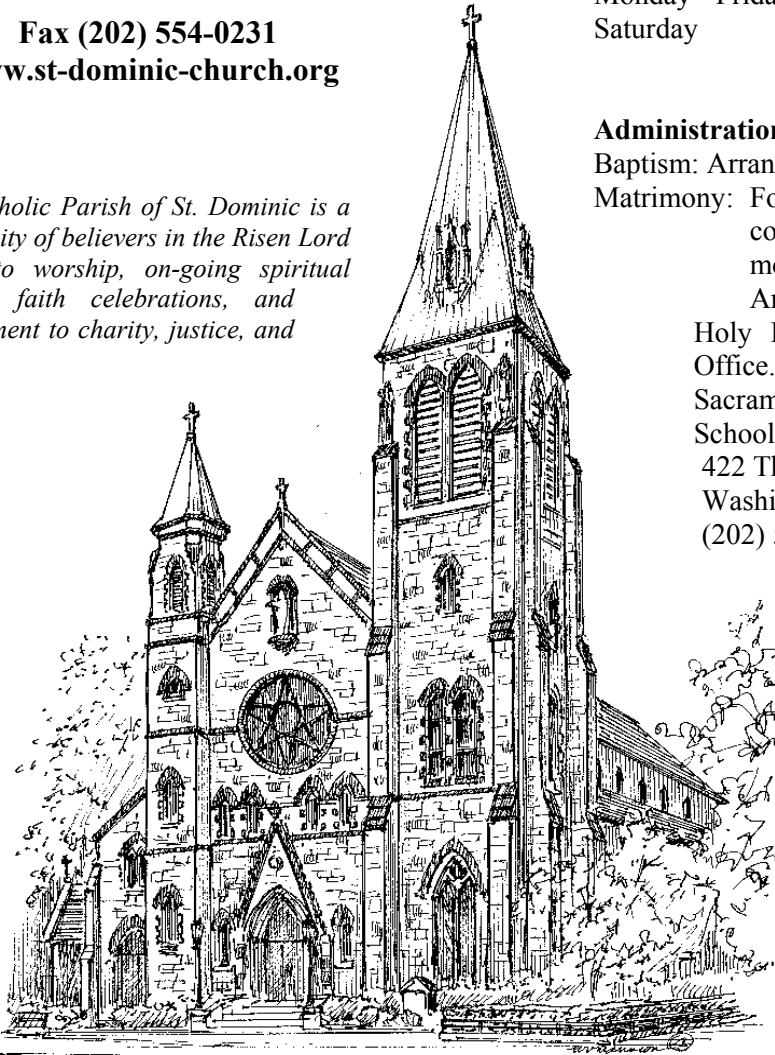

Pastor's Corner

Today --- this weekend actually --- is a very important anniversary for our parish. On the weekend of October 10-12, 1919, our parish had the blessing of celebrating the consecration of our church. This event is an important one for a parish and continues to be an important milestone in our parish's history. It is the reason we have the 12 candles on the walls of our church, symbolizing the 12 Apostles. This weekend when you worship here, you can obtain a Plenary Indulgence under the usual conditions because of this anniversary. The Masses in the church this weekend will not be that of the 28th Sunday of Ordinary time but will be the Mass on the Anniversary of the Consecration of a Church, with special readings and prayers.

It's getting on that time of year again when we start thinking of and seeing signs of Christmas. So it's the time to consider our Mass schedule for that special day.

Over the past several years, it has been noticed that most of our parishioners participate in the vigil Mass or in the Mass of Christmas Day. Most of the faithful at the midnight Mass are tourists or visitors or folks for whom this is their annual time in church. Many of our regular parishioners find it too late or are uncomfortable coming into the city at that time of night.

If you would like to have a midnight Mass at Christmas AND if you plan to attend, please let us know. Contact us via email or telephone at the priory office. Just let Ed or Denise know you are interested in continuing this Mass and leave your name with them. If most of our parishioners are not interested in and do not plan to come to midnight Mass, that special Mass will no longer be offered here. Please let us know by October 25 so that the music ministry has time to prepare the music should Midnight Mass be chosen.

There will be NO SERVICES in the church on Monday, October 12, a Federal Holiday.

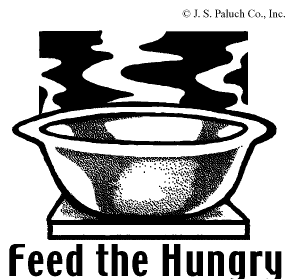

Parish Stewardship Program

In two weeks, we will begin a program that asks everyone to reflect on the amount that they give to Offertory. This review will ask several questions. They are:

1. Do I have a need to give or do I give only when there is a need?
2. Do I understand that there is an obligation to provide regular financial support to the parish?
3. Where does the parish fit relative to the other ways that I spend my money?
4. How much do I give to the parish on a weekly basis? (If you give monthly or quarterly, calculate your weekly commitment to put it in perspective.)
5. Is it too much, too little, or just right?
6. If I am not at the parish for one or more Sundays, do I make up the amount that I have not given?
7. How much will I give each week during the coming year?

**Comunidad Hispana

**Vigésimo octavo Domingo
del Tiempo Ordinario
11 de octubre de 2009**

Estimada Comunidad Hispana:

Esta sección del evangelio de Marcos está estructurada por los tres anuncios de la pasión, y en ella se continúa la instrucción a los discípulos sobre el misterio escondido en Jesús, el Hijo del hombre. Se le presenta al creyente el misterio del destino de este Mesías, que no lleva a cabo su misión por medio del triunfo o del poder, sino por medio del sufrimiento y de la muerte.

El discípulo es invitado a integrarse en esta lógica, abandonado sus esquemas mundanos. A eso vienen estas enseñanzas de Jesús sobre las riquezas y el llamamiento del discípulo. La abundancia de bienes materiales puede ser una barrera insalvable que dificulta la conversión y el seguimiento de Jesús: solamente un milagro de la gracia divina, para la cual no hay nada imposible (Mc 10, 27), puede arrancar al rico de su miseria humana y espiritual, e introducirlo en el camino de Cristo, que es un camino de abnegación y de pobreza. El dialogo dentro Pedro y Jesús, después del llamamiento fracasado del aquel hombre rico, se emplean dos pares de verbos. Pedro usa los verbos “dejar” y “seguir” aludiendo al primer llamado de Jesús a orillas del lago de Tiberíades (Mc 1m 16-20). JESUS MODIFICA LA EXPRESIÓN DE PEDRO CON UNA PAREJA DE PALABRAS MÁS POSITIVA: “DEJAR” Y “RECIBIR”.

La entrega de algunas realidades terrenas a Jesús no significa su desaparición, sino su valorización. Una profunda alegría, una seguridad y una paz inesperadas son ya, en el presente, la herencia permanente de quien ha renunciado a cualquier apego y posesión, para adherirse a Cristo y a su evangelio.

Según la Carta a los Hebreos la palabra de Dios es siempre provocación, espada, lluvia fecundante, revelación. La medida de nuestra autentica comprensión se hace visible sobre todo en la fuerza de provocación que ella tiene en nuestra vida.

Dejémonos, pues, provocar por la Palabra de Dios que escuchamos en la Eucaristía y donde el Señor nos ayuda a comprender **el seguimiento de él.**

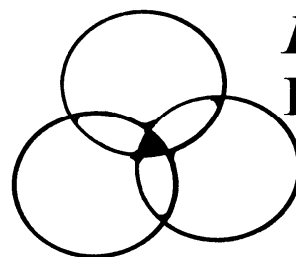
Community Information
