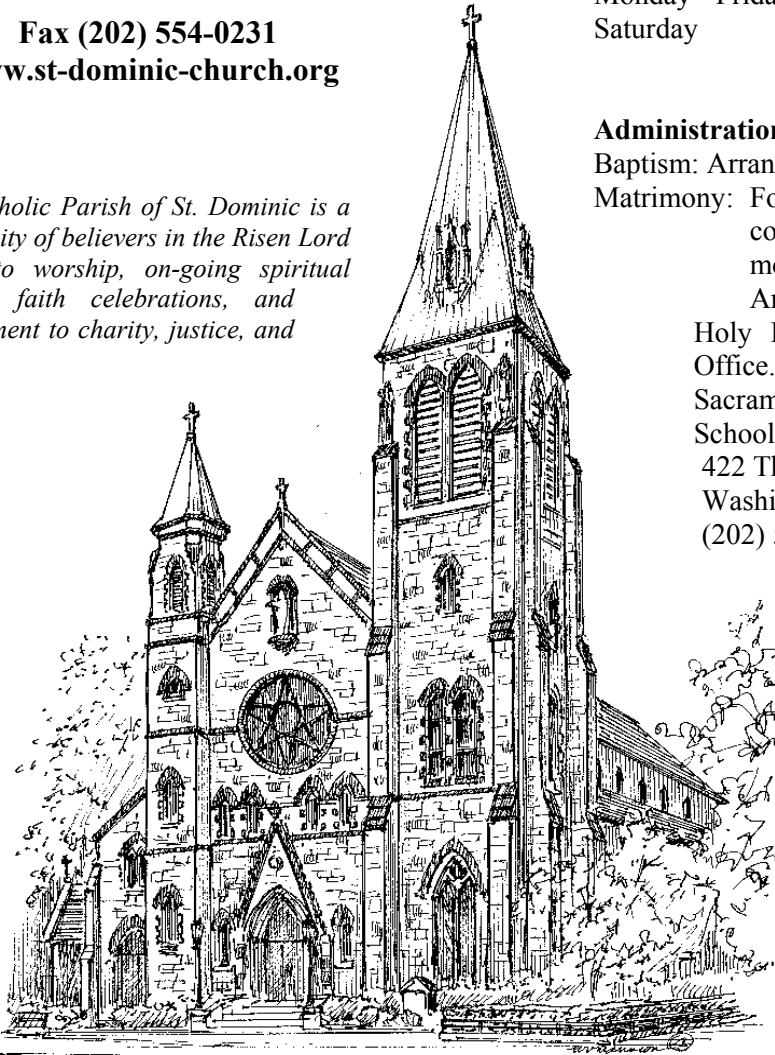

**Pastor's Corner**

The Book of the Dead is available in the sanctuary for you to write in the names of your beloved dead. These will be remembered at all the Masses in the church during the month of November. If you cannot navigate the stairs in the sanctuary, have someone bring the book to you and you can fill out the names and have the book returned to its place. Please use both sides of the pages in the book.

As I mentioned at the Masses last week, I ask that you prayerfully consider serving the needs of St. Dominic's with your talent and time as a liturgical minister. The liturgy is the high point of a parish's life since it brings us all together as the Body of Christ, with Christ as our head in praising and giving thanksgiving to God. We are always in need of ministers for the weekend celebrations here and often have to do "double duty" and sometimes even "triple duty"—something that is strongly discouraged by the Church's liturgical guidelines—and often ministers who are scheduled are unable to be present. If you would be willing to serve as Acolyte, Lector, Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion, or Musician, please contact the parish office and leave your contact information so that we might schedule the training sessions.

The Thanksgiving Day Mass will be celebrated at 10 a.m.. Bring an article from your Thanksgiving table for a blessing at that Mass. There will be NO SERVICES in the church on Friday, November 26.

2010 Calendars will be available beginning this weekend at all the entrances of the church.

**UPDATE:** Last week I mentioned here that we received no interest in a Midnight Mass for Christmas. After the bulletin had been sent to the printer, we received one phone call. Certainly it is not just a "numbers" issue that is involved. The need for liturgical ministers and the question about a Midnight Mass are closely connected.

**Liturgy Notes for the Feast of All Saints  
and the Feast of All Souls**

Since it falls on a Sunday this year, the solemnity of All Saints replaces the 31st Sunday in Ordinary Time. As a "solemnity," we celebrate all the baptized who have lived the Christian life, canonized or otherwise.

Tomorrow (All Souls Day) we give thanks for those who have died and who have blessed us with their lives.

We can never thank Pope John Paul II enough for making this feast so glorious. He canonized more saints during his reign than any other Pope, bringing the current tally to around 10,000. Although there are no nations in the kingdom of God, today we honor saints from many more nationalities than ever. People from all walks of life have been named, but martyrs lead the list.

The first saints to be venerated by the early Church were those who were martyred for the faith. By the middle of the third century, local churches had lists of martyrs and confessors that included their dates of death and burial places. We know confessors as priests who hear confessions, but in the early Church a confessor was a person who suffered for the faith yet did not die a martyr. After that, ascetics—those who lived a life of self-denial—were considered holy. Next in order of importance were consecrated virgins and bishops. Widows who served the Church were considered ascetics and, thus, also saints. All this happened before there was an official process for canonization in the Church. For interesting background on the latter, see *Making Saints: How the Catholic Church Determines Who Becomes a Saint, Who Doesn't, and Why*, by Kenneth Woodward (New York: Touchstone, 1996).

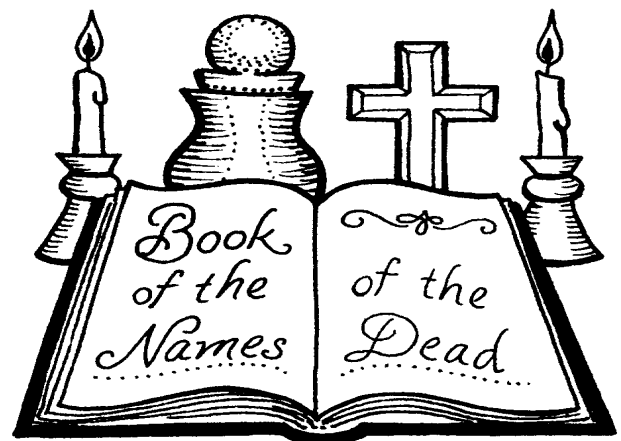
