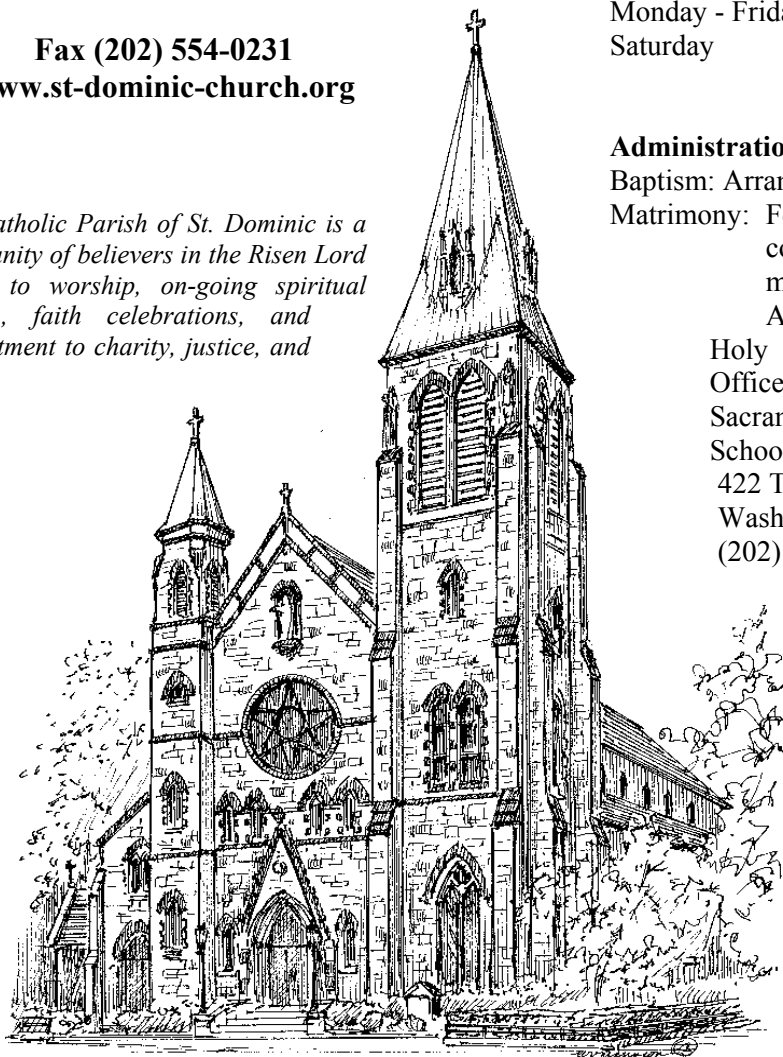

If you are a registered parishioner and your contribution is \$250 or less you **MUST** request a letter be sent. **Time, Talent, Treasure:** We treasure our talented volunteer ministers who give a little of their time to serve our parish as Lay Ministers of the Mass.

Today's second reading reminds us that God's Spirit produces different spiritual gifts in each person for the community's benefit. This message is especially important at this time when the resources of ordained ministers in the Catholic Church are being stretched ever thinner. Ministry in local churches is now being carried out by a rich diversity of people that includes priests, deacons, religious sisters and brothers, and laywomen and men. In 2005, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) reported over 30,000 lay people serving at parishes across the country. People serving in positions such as the lay liturgical ministries.

Our parish volunteer lay liturgical ministers serve our community at each weekday and weekend Mass — **and we need additional volunteers. To best support each of the weekend Masses, we need the assistance of 4 ushers, 1-2 acolytes, 2 lectors, 3 extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion (EMHC), and music ministers (a minimum of 12 volunteer ministers at each Mass). We need you!!**

Our parish sponsors formal and informal training for each liturgical ministry on a regular basis.

**Our parish ushers** are informally organized and frequently our experienced ushers recruit volunteers immediately before Mass (to assist with the gathering of the collection/gifts, etc.). Estimada Comunidad Hispana:

Las escenas del Evangelio nos explican la maravilla de **la encarnación de Dios en una humanidad compartida.**

Las bodas de Cana, con María como madrina de la fiesta, nos enseñan como relacionarnos con la vida., sus posibilidades y exigencias. Lo que María le dice a Jesús no parece fuera de lugar considerado lo que él ha hecho metiendo a todos sus amigos pescadores a la fiesta. No es por nada que se les acabo el vino.

En el relato, Jesús no se mueve de donde está. El manda a meseros a llenar de agua las tinajas. El no habla de vino. Solo pide que alguien de autoridad en la fiesta pruebe lo que esta en las tinajas. Al fin, se ha encontrado un vino bueno.

El Evangelio de Juan siempre da más importancia a lo que haremos nosotros que las acciones y palabras del mismo Jesús. Se espera una acción nuestra fundamentada en el poder del Espíritu que nos hace hijos de Dios, creadores y libertadores como El. Jesús dice que la palabra se hace efectiva en nosotros.

El mensaje del relato nos llena del poder del Resucitado, dándonos el regalo de una celebración relacionada a la vida y no aislada de ella. Jesús nos explica como convertir las aguas de la vida en vino. “*Llenen de agua en vino,*” Es por llenar las tinajas hasta el borde que se convierte en una gracia creadora y refrescante: la cambia en lo que nos da a nosotros mismos y a los compañeros un aspecto nuevo y el deseo de vivir cantando y bailando ante Dios.

La celebración de Cana hace creer a los discípulos. Por esto, su celebración no se queda en Cana; se les va derramando con el vino de las tinajas en los caminos del discipulado. La celebración jamás es suficiente por sí sola, sino por la manera en que se ubica en el contexto de nuestras luchas y compromisos.

En las celebraciones qué nosotros **llamamos EUCARISTÍA**, no debe haber un aspecto de obligación a un rito; sin embargo, debe, existir un deseo de expresar **por palabra y obra** nuestras gracias por la vida un don inmerecido, derramado de Su abundancia, por el mundo.
